

#### INTERNATIONAL SOCIETY FOR FOLK NARRATIVE RESEARCH

The International Congress for Folktale Research was held in Kiel and Copenhagen from the 19th to the 29th August, 1959. At the invitation of Professor Kurt Ranke, Chairman of the organising committee, Mr. J. Cassar Pullicino represented Malta at the Congress. His paper *The Study of Maltese Folktales* has since been published in the Proceedings of the Congress.


On the 29th August, 1959 the Congress set up a Commission to deliberate about the foundation of the International Society for Folk Narrative Research. This Commission met in Paris in August, 1960 and certain preliminary resolutions were adopted, pending final approval by the first General Assembly. The Headquarters of the Society will be in Paris.

Mr. Cassar Pullicino is one of 94 scholars who have been appointed by the Commission to be Foundation Members of the Society. The official foundation meeting will take place in Antwerp (Belgium) from Sept. 6-8, 1962. Besides the affairs of the Society, the problem of an International Catalogue of Folk Legends will be discussed.

The next International Congress for Folk Narrative Research will take place in Athens in 1964 or 1965.
